His research interests include fatigue and fracture of steel structures, structural integrity assessment, offshore and marine structures, digital twins, and AI-enabled predictive maintenance systems. His recent work focuses on physics-informed machine learning for fatigue prognosis, digital twin frameworks for welded joints, offshore renewable energy systems, and coastal resilience infrastructure. He has published extensively in leading international journals and actively contributes to the international research community through editorial appointments, keynote lectures, and professional committee service in structural and offshore engineering

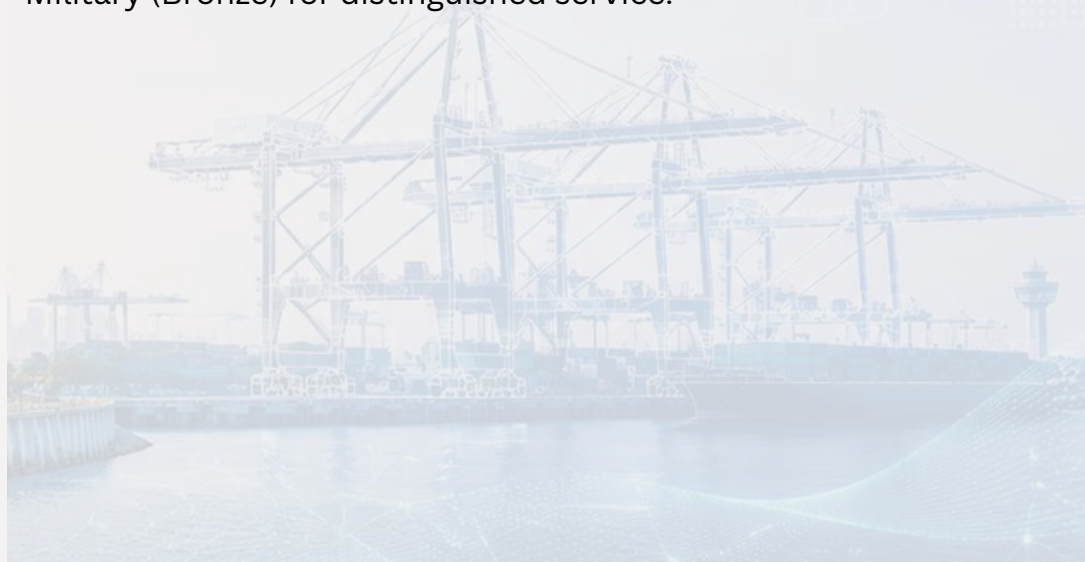

Session 3A: Maritime Digital Twin - Bridging Digital and Reality

Developed by the MPA, the Maritime Digital Twin integrates real-time and historical data with advanced simulation tools to empower agencies, industry, and researchers. As a robust platform for operational planning and rapid prototyping, it allows stakeholders to stress-test concepts and optimize workflows in a virtual environment. By enabling the validation of new solutions before live implementation, the Maritime Digital Twin serves as a critical innovation sandbox, helping the maritime ecosystem scale new capabilities with precision and confidence.

Dr Haobin Li is a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Industrial Systems Engineering and Management at the National University of Singapore, Academic Director of Master of Science Program in Maritime Technology and Management (MSc MTM), and Co-Director of the Centre of Excellence in Modelling and Simulation for Next Generation Ports (C4NGP). His research focuses on discrete-event simulation, simulation-based optimisation, digital twins, and their applications in port operations, maritime logistics, warehouse systems, and complex industrial systems. He is the developer of the O2DES framework, an object-oriented discrete-event simulation framework designed to support modular, extensible, and decision-centric modelling of complex operational systems.

Dr Li has led and contributed to multiple industry-oriented research projects on port and logistics digital twins, including modelling and simulation studies for next-generation ports, global shipping networks, warehouse operations, and maritime logistics ecosystems. His work emphasises the use of simulation not only as a performance evaluation tool, but also as a transparent and reusable experimental testbed for analysing system structure, operational behaviour, decision logic, and system-wide consequences. He is currently a Council Member of the INFORMS Simulation Society and an overseas member of the Technical Committee on Port and Shipping Economic Systems Engineering under the Systems Engineering Society of China (SESC).

Session 3B: Digital Twin for Port Operations - Digital Twins in Maritime Systems Transformation: Applications, Capabilities and Future Directions

Digital twin technologies are playing an increasingly important role in the transformation of maritime systems, enabling enhanced visibility, simulation, data integration and decision support across port operations, infrastructure planning, asset monitoring and shipping networks.

Drawing on practical experience from the development of digital twins for port operations, this presentation will examine different maritime use cases and the varying technical capabilities required to support them. The session will also discuss implementation challenges, system-level considerations and the potential of digital twins to improve operational efficiency, resilience and strategic decision-making within the maritime industry.

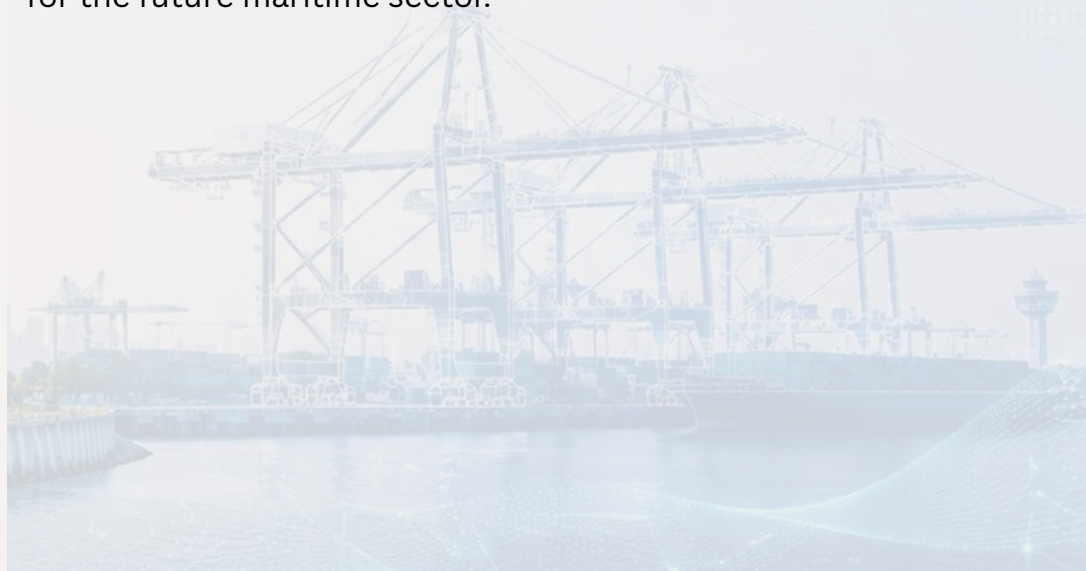

Dr Xiuju Fu is the Director of the Maritime AI Research Programme and Group Manager under Systems Science Department at Institute of High Performance Computing, Agency for Science, Technology and Research (A*STAR) in Singapore. With expertise in AI, big data intelligence, simulation, and optimization techniques, she focuses on advancing complex system management and enhancement. Recognized for her contributions, she was honored as an SMI Fellow in 2023. Currently, she spearheads the Maritime AI Research Programme in Singapore, driving research and development initiatives in maritime data excellence, AI modeling excellence, maritime AI computing, and application excellence. Her efforts aim to foster the development and application of big data and AI in the maritime industry.

Session 3C: AI and Big Data Intelligence for Next-Generation Maritime Operations

In this talk, several key research findings and AI applications developed under the Maritime AI Research Programme will be presented. The research highlights the transformative potential of AI in maritime shipping, spanning traffic safety enhancement, maritime decarbonisation, and the optimisation of operational resilience and efficiency. The session will explore how AI is reshaping the maritime industry through intelligent decision support, predictive analytics, and next-generation digital capabilities.

In addition, the talk will introduce the System for Maritime AI Excellence (MAX) framework being developed by A*STAR. This strategic initiative aims to unify, scale, and elevate maritime AI capabilities across the ecosystem, supporting the development of trustworthy, impactful, and operationally deployable AI solutions for the future maritime sector.

Session 3D: Jurong Port Digital Twin - JP Glass

As Jurong Port advances its digitalisation journey, JP Glass has emerged as a key platform providing a unified operational view across the port ecosystem. Developed as a digital twin solution, JP Glass integrates data from multiple sources to deliver near real-time visibility of vessel movements, cargo operations, resource deployment, warehouse activities and yard utilisation.

This presentation will share the development and implementation of JP Glass, highlighting how digital twin technology supports operational decision-making, enhances situational awareness and improves coordination across port operations. Participants will gain insights into Jurong Port's approach towards leveraging geospatial technologies and data-driven solutions to optimise productivity, safety and resource management.

The session will also explore the future evolution of JP Glass, including the transition towards enhanced 3D visualisation capabilities and the role of digital twins in supporting next-generation port operations and maritime innovation.

Session 4A: Beyond Conventional Reclamation: Building the Next-Generation Port

As future port developments become larger, deeper and more sustainable, and increasingly constrained by time and environmental demands, the industry faces a fundamental question – can tomorrow's ports still be built using yesterday's methods?

This presentation explores how Singapore is redefining the future of port development and land reclamation through innovation, advanced construction technologies and sustainability-driven solutions. Transforming reclamation from a conventional construction activity into a highly connected and intelligent ecosystem where autonomous technologies, predictive analytics and adaptive construction systems optimise the way we plan, construct and manage maritime infrastructure development.

Wen Yao is Assistant Vice President (Tuas Digital Excellence) at PSA's Regional IT Southeast Asia, leading the development of next-generation Terminal Operating Systems (TOS) for the next phase of Tuas Port operations in 2028.

Previously, he served as Terminal Manager for Tuas Phase 1, overseeing the start-up, stabilization, and ramp-up of terminal operations.

Session 4B: PSA's Automated Container Terminal Operations at the Next Generation Tuas Port

Drawing from his operational experience at Tuas, Wen Yao will share how does the automated operations look like at Tuas Port, and delve into how automation, digitalisation, and systems integration are transforming modern port operations at scale.
